

**Bachelor of Arts in Political Science Curriculum Map**  
(Effective Summer 2016 and after)

The curriculum map provides insight and direction for students to graduate in four years. With the assistance of a student's academic advisor and department chairperson, the map will provide a guide between what should be taken term by term and where the student is with respect to grades received in courses. Milestones are noted on the map and serve as hints regarding what courses and/or activities must be completed that term. Please note that every term does not have a milestone. Prerequisites are also noted providing the student and his/her advisor a true indication of where the student falls within the curriculum. In this particular document, key prerequisites are listed that can prevent a student from moving along in the curriculum if not met. Also, note that the Department of History & Political Science only considers the grade of "C" or higher as meeting the prerequisite. A grade of "C" or better is required in each course in history taken for credit for a major or a minor in Political Science.
